

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#### **8 Route information**

Cars will start stages at 30 seconds intervals (subject to MSA approval). The format of the event will be that all the competitors in the Lee Holland main rally will compete on the first running of the stage and then have their second run through the stage. Cars on the Junior Rally will then run their first time through a stage and will immediately be interposed from the first running of a stage straight back in to the second running of that stage at the next available 30 second slot. The event will consist of up to 8 stages with a mileage of approximately 45 miles for both events giving Juniors the same mileage as main field, subject to MSA approval of the stages. These stages will be timed to the nearest whole second in accordance with R31.1.3. The stage mileage takes the form of 100% sealed surface circuit and perimeter roads. There may be a short section with loose top surface. Any route changes will be displayed on the Official Notice Board located at signing on.

#### 9 Classes

PLEASE NOTE: - All competing cars MUST comply with (where applicable) Technical regulation(s) Sections J, K (Safety), L and R of the MSA Yearbook 2017 edition.

F-Cars up to 1000cc as per the current F1000 Rally Club Challenge 2017 regulations and/or Micra K11 regulations with the exception of tyres for non championship registered contenders. Any 1000cc vehicles not complying with this requirement including Super 1000 must be entered in class A Classes continued:- Cars fitted with forced induction must have their capacity multiplied by 1.7 (J5.4.1)to determine class to be entered I.e 1598 cc x 1.7= 2717 cc to be entered in class D

#### 17 Lateness

R 32.1.1 Competitors will be required to make up lateness at <u>ALL MTC's</u> following servicing/rest periods. Apart from your due time at MTC1, all other Due Time's at the next arrival MTC will be given at the MTC as you finish a stage. All stage start MTC's will also act as Stage Arrival Controls.

#### 18 Identification

Competitors will be identified by regulation size numbers as per R 6.1.3(a) J4 (BLACK ON A WHITE BACKGROUND), which MUST BE IN POSITION ON THE VEHICLE WHEN PRESENTING THE VEHICLE FOR SOUND TESTING & SCRUTINEERING. In addition championship decals and or sponsor decals supplied by the organisers incorporating publicity for the event must be displayed on the car in positions advised by the championship or event organisers. H29.1.1, 2 & 3.

#### 19. Modifications to Penalties

Marking and penalties will be as printed in the appropriate section of the MSA General Regulations R32.1 & R32.2. Except as modified below.

- 32.2 a) Not reporting or reporting OTL at a Control. RETIRED.
- R32.2 (j) For each minute before or after due time at a main time/stage arrival control 60 sec's (Crew and car must be present and ready to start). The maximum lateness at the MTC/Stage Arrival Control shall be 5 min after due arrival time. Failure to report at the stage arrival / MTC within this time period, with car & crew, will be deemed as being OTL and having RETIRED see R11.6.1
- R32.2 (p) Breach of regulation R25.6. If you go onto the grass at any point of the stage (including chicanes) and you are reported by an event official or Judge of Fact for incorrect maintenance of route, you will be deemed to have left the prescribed stage route and not performed the stage correctly and will be penalised as stage maximum for an incorrect route taken . All stage routes are run on hard surfaces. Failure to negotiate chicanes will also be penalised with stage maximum.
- R32.2.2 (aa) Failure to follow the instructions by an official. Reporting to the Cof C for possible Exclusion. Additionally a penalty of EXCLUSION may be applied on the first offence for the following
- R38.3.1 Any COMPETITOR, or anyone under the control of a competitor, i.e. SERVICE CREW etc., found outside the official paddock/service area or official spectator areas without express permission from a Clerk of Course will result in the competitor being EXCLUDED.
- R32.2 (I) Any COMPETITOR, or anyone under the control of a competitor, i.e. SERVICE CREW etc., driving/riding any vehicle reported by any official, to be travelling at excessive speed in the service, or stage start/finish area may result in the competitor being **EXCLUDED** (10-mph max.)

REMEMBER: - AS THE COMPETING CREW YOU ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE ACTIONS OF ANYONE ASSOCIATED WITH YOUR ENTRY AND PENALTIES WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED. ANYONE CAUGHT OR REPORTED FOR PRACTICING AT ANY TIME WILL BE EXCLUDED

R41.4.3 (R25.9) Pace notes will not be permitted on this event. Any competitor found in possession of any pace notes will be penalised as per R32.2 (q).

#### **20.**Modifications to General Regulations

All other General Regulations of the MSA apply as written except for the following, which are modified, or your attention is drawn to in particular.

A novice crew shall be a crew **neither member** of which has won an award (other than a team or marque award) in a competition of similar or higher status and type.

#### Fuel

The MSA has granted permission for competitors to use fuel to FIA Appendix J, Article 252, Art 9 for competitors in the ANWCC Stage Rally Championship, the Anglesey Rally Challenge, and competitors other than Historics, not registered in any other championship of which the Lee Holland Stages is a qualifying round.

#### INFO RE VITAL EQUIPMENT SUPPLIES AND REFUELLING AREA.

The Motorsport News Circuit Rally Championship announces partnership with Vital Equipment

The Motorsport News Circuit Rally Championship (MNCRC) is delighted to announce a new partnership with Vital Equipment, which will become the official fuel supplier for the 2016/17 championship.

The initial 12-month deal will see Vital Equipment technicians on hand with safe pumping facilities to supply their high quality super unleaded fuel and FIA 102 type fuel for competitors at each round of the championship. Vital Equipment will also create a safe refuelling zone for competitors and teams, reducing risk in the service areas. Although Vital Equipment will have a substantial presence in the paddock, the MNCRC will continue to have a non-controlled fuel policy in the regulations.

#### How It Works

Vital Equipment will attend each round of the championship and will provide dispensing facilities for competitors to buy there high quality super unleaded Carless Hiperflow Super +) or the FIA 102 type fuel (Carless Hiperflow Turbo Ultimate DEV2). Competitors are advised to submit an order in advance of each event for their fuel requirements. A spare supply of fuel cannot be guaranteed on the event. The absolute last opportunity to arrange fuel supply would be on the day of Scrutineering. For those wishing to use their own fuel Vital Equipment will provide a self refuelling area for the use of any competitor.

#### Please Note:

As a result of these fantastic facilities competitors will no longer be able to **SELF** re-fuel in any other area of the venues. This also applies to non-championship competitors.

R5.4.3 Only the nominated driver on the entry form may drive throughout the event

**R30.1** Controls and special stages will open 5 minutes before the due time of car No 0 and close 5 minutes after the stage maximum lateness time of the last car into stage, or when all cars have cleared the stage if this is earlier.

R11.6 & R32.2 (a) (Main time controls) Competitors failing to visit or reporting outside their maximum lateness at MTC's will be deemed to have retired and their results will not be shown in the MAIN results. However, they may continue to run in the Trophy Rally subject to complying with conditions applicable to that class. (See special notes re Trophy Rally)

**R24.4.5 &.6** All stages will operate a Yellow Flag system which will be used to stop any stage should the situation warrant it for the release of emergency vehicles onto the circuit. The deployment of Yellow Flags will be in accordance with this regulation. Should a Yellow Flag situation occur then you must act in accordance with the procedure given in these regulations

- **R25.6.4** i.e. on passing a Yellow Flag, you must significantly reduce speed as well as being prepared to stop at any time and must not at any time overtake any safety vehicle.
- **R25.6.5** You must not proceed until permission is given by an Official. **Failure to do so will incur a penalty imposed by Clerk Of Course up to and including Exclusion.**
- R25.8 & R25.8.1 Stages starting on 30 second intervals will not be given the 30 second to go signal
- **R29.3.2** Due to the close proximity of some junctions and chicanes, split/merge and chicane diagram countdown boards may not be used.

PLEASE TAKE SPECIAL NOTE THAT IN ORDER TO OBTAIN THE EXTRA MILEAGE WE HAVE HAD TO INCLUDE CHICANES FOR SPLITS AND MERGES. WE WOULD THEREFORE ASK YOU TO TREAT THESE AREAS WITH EXTRA CARE AS STAGE HOLDUPS WILL ONLY RESULT IN LOST STAGES AT THE END OF THE DAY. WE WILL BE LOOKING IN PARTICULAR AT THE ATTITUDE OF COMPETITORS THROUGH THESE POINTS AND ANY CAR REPORTED FOR DAMAGING THEM WILL BE PENALISED 5 MINUTES PER OCCASION AT THE DISCRETION OF THE C OF C.

- **R32.2** Penalties for road sections/service area will be applied.
- R38.1.2 A specific area will be set-aside for servicing cars and NO servicing will be permitted outside this area. Only ONE service vehicle per entry will be allowed in the paddock area. No other vehicles will be allowed in this area on the day of the event. Trailers MUST be parked where instructed.
- R48.5.1 to & including 48.5.13 & Section L Tyres must comply with the appropriate regulations in these sections
- **R 40.1** To be classified as a finisher a competitor must complete the course without incurring the penalty of exclusion.
- **46.1.5.** All vehicles must carry a small spill kit complying with J.5.20.13. Should you stop anywhere on circuit causing a loss of fluid then the spill kit must be used to prevent the fluid spreading.

#### Junior Formula 1000 Rally Challenge 2017

This year the Lee Holland has again been selected to run a round of the **Junior Formula 1000 Rally Challenge 2017** as defined by the championship rules. As part of the MSA requirements/regulations for this championship, competitors in the championship must run on the stages by themselves, i.e. there must not be any cars from the main part of the Lee Holland event on the stage at the same time as the Junior's. To achieve this there has to be a gap between the two events which therefore stretches to the limit the running of all 8 stages within the allowed time that the circuit can operate.

In order to achieve this, cars in the Junior event will be interposed from the first running of the stage straight back into the second running of the stage and road timing between stages will be operating. Just as road timing will be operating in the main event. As soon as all cars from the main event have completed the pair of stages, or maximum lateness of the last car in the main event has been reached, the Junior Rally stages will be started.

Once a Junior stage has started no cars from the main event will be allowed to move on the stage until the juniors have finished their two runs through. If you are in the main rally and have stopped on stage for any reason and the juniors have started YOU MUST NOT MOVE TILL THEY HAVE FINISHED THEIR TWO RUNS THROUGH THE STAGE. (Junior runners will be denoted by running numbers 101 upwards.)

**PENALTY FOR DISOBEYING THIS INSTRUCTION WILL BE EXCLUSION FROM THE EVENT, REPORTING TO THE STEWARDS OF THE MEETING AND THE MSA**. If you are excluded in these circumstances you will not be allowed to rejoin in the Trophy Rally even if you would normally have been eligible. After the Juniors have finished you will be given permission to return to the paddock.

#### **PUNCTURES AND / OR DAMAGED VEHICLE PROCEDURE**

As part of the conditions of hiring the venue you are not allowed to run on the circuit with a punctured tyre. If any competitor gets a puncture they must **pull over to a safe location off the stage** as soon as practical and replace the wheel. Should you not carry a spare wheel then you must pull over **to a safe location as soon as safely practical** and the crew must vacate the car and move to a safe position behind the circuit barriers and remain there until the vehicle is safely recovered. OK boards and triangle must be displayed.

Only wheels carried in the vehicle at stage start will be allowed to be used to change a puncture. **NO SERVICE CREW MEMBERS MAY ENTER ANY PART OF THE CIRCUIT**. Should anyone do this or receive outside assistance the competing car will be immediately EXCLUDED. Trophy rally rules will apply to anyone RETIRING in the first half of the stages but NOT TO THOSE EXCLUDED.

It is also a condition of hire that no vehicle be allowed to continue on the circuit should any part of the bodywork or any of the vehicle's components be dragging/touching on the surface of the circuit. You may pull **gently/slowly** onto the grass at the side of the track in order to facilitate the safe removal of a damaged bodywork part or component, if this is practicable, and then **gently/slowly** off the grass to regain the circuit once this is done. **Failure to replace the wheel or remove any dragging part or component of the vehicle along the surface of the circuit will result in a penalty of <b>EXCLUSION**.

All designated marshals will be deemed judges of fact and will report infringements to the Clerk of the Course as soon as possible.

These are requirement's of the Anglesey Circuit, to prevent damage to the surface of the circuit. As part of your contract with us, by signing to abide with these regulations, and whilst competing on this event you will be liable personally, for any cost of repair to the surface caused by your vehicle or its parts.

FURTHER. Any fluid spillage on the circuit or in the paddock must be reported to the organisers so that suitable arrangements can be made with the circuit staff to clear it up. All waste oil must be placed in the waste oil tank. NO oil containers to be left at the venue when you leave.

YOU MUST TAKE ALL YOUR USED TYRES HOME WITH YOU FROM THE CIRCUIT/ PADDOCK AREA WHEN YOU LEAVE. YOU MUST NOT PUT THEM IN ANY OF THE SKIPS

Any competitor, or their crew, contravening these requirements will be EXCLUDED from the results and reported to the MSA.

#### "motordrive seats" TROPHY RALLY (applicable to both events)

Pendle District M C & Garstang & Preston Motor Club will promote (TIME PERMITTING) a Trophy Rally. To qualify, any competitor who has retired or gone OTL (**NOT HAVING BEEN EXCLUDED**) from the event will be permitted to re-start as part of the Trophy Rally, (following satisfactory technical re-scrutineering). The Trophy Rally will commence from Stage 5.

Competitors in the Trophy Rally will be interposed within their respective remaining event competitors, in their original seeded order. Competitors in the Trophy Rally must be the same driver, co-driver and car as originally entered in the main event. The Trophy Rally runs to the same regulations as the main event.

The organisers reserve the right to not start or halt the Trophy Rally at any time. The organisers also reserve the right to exclude any competitor in the Trophy Rally found to be baulking, or impeding competitors still competing in the main event. Competitors in the Trophy Rally will not be deemed to have finished the main event and will therefore have their results compiled in a separate results table.

**Trophy Rally - Juniors.** The above will also apply to the Junior Formula 1000 Rally Challenge 2017 competitors.

#### 21. General Information

Named designated radio crews and ALL named Sector Marshals will be judges of fact for driving standards Sections **R24.7 & .8** and correct route. **R25.6**. Start officials will be judges of fact for sections **R24.7.3 & (.10)**. All Senior Officials and named officials of the event will be judges of fact for all items listed under **Sections R24**, **R25.6 & 25.6.1&.2**.

**R41.1** The event takes place wholly on private land.

The organisers times and mileage's will be deemed to be correct.

Please be aware of helmet regulations R25.3.1 & Section K10. Also, in light of the recent controversy regarding the legality of certain roll bars, your attention is brought to regulation section K1in its entirety. Also the requirement of Frontal Head Restraint systems from January 2016

Should any crew have an insurance claim they will be responsible for reimbursement of any costs or excess that the organising clubs may have to pay on their behalf. Failure to do so would result in reporting that crew to the MSA.

Intending competitors who are not members of invited clubs can obtain membership of the Organising clubs, valid until 31st December 2017, for a fee of £12.00

Final Instructions having the same authority as these ASR's will be sent to competitors a few days before the event. Any notice signed by a Clerk of Course displayed during the event will have the same authority as these ASR's. A maximum speed of 10 mph will apply at all times, except when competing on a stage, within the confines of the venue and on all private roads leading to the venue. Petrol is NOT available at the venue. Refreshments will be available. No bonfires may be lit at the venue, please take all litter home with you or put it in a bin. Please note the event will incorporate "Road Timing" using normal Target Timing system.

#### 22. GARAGES

The organisers are negotiating with the circuit for the use of the 11 pit garages for competitors. Each garage has room for 2 competing cars and we expect the cost to be £120 per garage so if 2 cars share it will be £60 per competing car. Payment for garage spaces must accompany entry. Spaces will be allocated on 1<sup>st</sup> come 1<sup>st</sup> served basis. Should demand exceed availability the organisers will operate a reserve list with spaces being allocated in receipt order if any garages become available through entry withdrawal. The organisers will issue refunds to unsuccessful garage applicants at signing on.

#### 23) Accommodation

If accommodation is required Anglesey Tourist Office will be pleased to help. They will be able to book your accommodation for you and are open normal office hour's 7 days a week. You may camp at the venue on the Saturday night.
