

Article 2 Jurisdiction

The event will be held under:

- 5.1 All competitors must supply digital copies of (and produce if requested) valid Motorsport UK competition licence, club membership card and competition car log book/passport

Article 8 Route information

- 8.1 Cars will start stages at 30 seconds intervals (subject to Motorsport UK approval).
- 8.2 The format of the event will be that all the competitors in the Lee Holland Memorial Junior rally will compete on the first running of the stage and then have their second run through the stage before competitors in the Senior Rally attempt each pair of stages.
- 8.3 The event will consist of up to 8 stages with a mileage of approximately 45 miles.
- 8.4 These stages will be timed to the nearest whole second in accordance with R31.1.3.
- 8.5 The stage mileage takes the form of 100% sealed surface, and will consist of the circuit and perimeter roads
- 8.6 Any route changes will be displayed on the Official Notice Board

Article 9 Classes

- 9.1 The event will consist of 8 classes as follows:
- A Cars with engines up to 1400cc
- B Cars with engines from 1401cc up to & inc. 1600cc
- C- Cars with engines from 1601cc up to & inc. 2000cc plus cars with forced induction under 1300cc
- D Two Wheel Drive Cars with engines over 2000cc
- E ALL Four Wheel Drive Cars
- F Cars up to 1000cc
- R -Road Rally Cars (Complying with R.18 of current Blue Book and must have stage rally passport/logbook)
- J Junior Formula 1000 cars
- 9.2 Cars fitted with forced induction must have their capacity multiplied by 1.7 (J5.4.1) to determine class to be entered i.e 1598 cc \times 1.7= 2717 cc to be entered in class D/E except vehicles with capacities less than 1300cc

- 10.3 Other than the Geoff Brown Trophy & replica, no crew member may win more than one award.
- 10.4 All award winners or their representative must attend the post event presentation to receive their awards. Awards for 1^{st} & 2^{nd} overall must be signed for
- 10.5 In addition to 10.4 Overall award winners may be expected to attend, with their competing car, any post event publicity event prior to the main award ceremony.
- 10.6 Non-compliance with 10.5 may result in the disqualification from the event and the forfeit of any championship points scored on the event.





Article 11 Entries

- 11.1 The entry list opens on 20th January 2023 (19:00hrs) and finally closes on Friday 24th February 2023.
- 11.2 The entry fee is £320 and is payable at time of entry by bank transfer of full amount, the payment details are included in the entry form.
- 11.3 Entry is only available on line through www.rallies.info/webentry/2023/leeholland.
- 11.4 Entries will be acknowledged, received and accepted via e-mail
- 11.5 Entries will be accepted in order of receipt of a fully completed on-line entry application form including entry fees. D12.1.4
- 11.6 Withdrawn entries will be refunded in full any payments made. Written notice by letter/e-mail to withdraw must be received by the Secretary of the Meeting by 12:00 Hrs on 24th February 2023 to qualify. Any entry withdrawn after this date will only be refunded, less £25 administration, at the organisers' discretion or if the entry is taken over by a reserve entry.
- 11.7 The secretary of the meeting is: Mrs Jade Benson
- 11.8 The maximum entry for the meeting is 80 + 10 reserves. The minimum number of runners is 50 and the max number will be 80. Should the minimum figures not be reached the organisers reserve the right to cancel the event.
- 11.9 Each entry will allow entry to the venue for 6 people comprising of competing crew and up to 4 additional personnel, names of whom must be included on the entry form. Anyone not included in the 6 will be charged £10.00 entry by circuit staff at the circuit entrance

Article 12 Technical

- 12.1 All competing cars MUST comply with (where applicable) Technical regulation(s) Sections J, K (Safety), L and R of the Motorsport UK Yearbook 2023 edition.
- 12.2 As this event takes place wholly on private property cars trailered to the event need not be taxed (R46.1.1), but must have a registration document, valid MOT certificate (where applicable) and MSA Log Book/Passport Motorsport UK Passport
- 12.3 It will not be possible to scrutineer for Passports prior to the start of the event.





Article 13 Results

13.1 Provisional results will be published as soon as possible after the event as per section D26. These will stay provisional for 30mins provided no protests are received C5.2

Article 14 Protests

14.1 Any protests must be lodged as appropriate and in accordance with C5

Article 15 Scrutineering and signing on

- 15.1 All Signing-on must be done electronically prior to the event using event specific Motorsport UK Competitor Signing-on declarations which will be e-mailed to competitors on Friday 20th February 2023. These declarations must be completed and returned by Tuesday 24th February 2023 by every driver and co-driver, including any reserve entries, to ensure you retain your place in the event!
- 15.2 All competitors will be required to self-certify their own cars and equipment.
- 15.3 All competing cars are to be scrutineered. This will take place between 14.00 and 18.00 on Saturday 4th March 2023. Competitors will be advised of the specific time they should present their vehicle for scrutineering (R5.1.1).
- 15.4 Limited scrutineering, BY APPLICATION AND WRITTEN PERMISSION ONLY, will take place at the venue on Sunday 5^{th} March 2023 between 7:00 & 8:15.
- 15.5 All cars will be required to attend a noise check in accordance with Motorsport UK requirements. Competitors unable to pass at this time will not be allowed to start the event, and no entry refunds will be given Note: The noise limit is 100dB(A) (0.5m test) @ 4,500 rpm. (R4.1)
- 15.6 Document collection location and times will be notified in the Final Instructions.
- 15.7 These documents will provide all the information necessary to comply with R33.1 and will contain all details of the special stages.
- 15.8 Any changes to these requirements will be notified in the final instructions or by e-mail

Article 16 Lateness

- 16.1 R 32.1.1 Competitors will be required to make up lateness at <u>ALL TC's</u> following servicing/rest periods.
- 16.2 Apart from your due time at MTC1, all other Due Time's at the next arrival Stage Start Arrival TC will be given at the TC as you finish a stage.





Article 17 Identification

- 17.1 Competitors will be identified by numbers as per R 6.1.3(b), which MUST BE IN POSITION ON THE VEHICLE WHEN PRESENTING THE VEHICLE FOR NOISE TESTING & SCRUTINEERING. R6.4. these will be provided by the organisers.
- 17.2 In addition championship decals and or sponsor decals supplied by the organisers incorporating publicity for the event must be displayed on the car in positions advised by the championship or event organisers. H28

Article 18 Modifications to Penalties

- 18.1 Marking and penalties will be as printed in the appropriate section of the Motorsport UK Ltd General Regulations R32.1 & R32.2. Except as modified below.
- 18.2 R32.2 (j) For each minute before or after due time at a main time/stage arrival control 60 sec's (Crew and car must be present and ready to start). The maximum lateness at the MTC/Stage Arrival Control shall be 5 min after due arrival time. Failure to report at the stage arrival / MTC within this time period, with car & crew, will be deemed as being OTL and having RETIRED see R11.6.1
- 18.3 R32.2 (p) Breach of regulation R25.6. If you go onto the grass at any point of the stage (including chicanes) and you are reported by an event official or Judge of Fact for incorrect maintenance of route, you will be deemed to have left the prescribed stage route and not performed the stage correctly and will be penalised as stage maximum for an incorrect route taken . Failure to negotiate chicanes will also be penalised with stage maximums.
- 18.4 R32.2.2 (aa) Failure to follow the instructions by an official. Reporting to the $\it C$ of $\it C$ for possible Disqualification
- 18.5 R38.3.1 Any COMPETITOR, or anyone under the control of a competitor, i.e. SERVICE CREW etc., found outside the official paddock/service area or official spectator areas without express permission from a Clerk of Course will result in the competitor being DISQUALIFIED
- 18.6 R32.2 (I) Any COMPETITOR, or anyone under the control of a competitor, i.e. SERVICE CREW etc., driving/riding any vehicle reported by any official, to be travelling at excessive speed in the service area may result in the competitor being DISQUALIFIED (10-mph max.)
- 18.7 REMEMBER: AS THE COMPETING CREW YOU ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE ACTIONS OF ANYONE ASSOCIATED WITH YOUR ENTRY AND PENALTIES WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED. ANYONE CAUGHT OR REPORTED FOR WARMING TYRES & BRAKES AT ANY TIME WILL BE DISQUALIFIED
- 18.8 R41.4.3 (R25.9) Pace notes will not be permitted on this event. Any competitor found in possession of any pace notes (whether relating to this event or any other event) will be penalised as per R32.2 (q).
- 18.9 Competitors are reminded that the paddock area has been resurfaced and therefore the circuit management are prohibiting the use of pegs or stakes which cause holes in the tarmac. Any incidents of damage to tarmac will incur a £150 fine per hole. Please ensure all members of your service crew are aware of this.





Article 19. Modifications to General Regulations

All other General Regulations of Motorsport UK Ltd apply as written except for the following, which are modified, or your attention is drawn to in particular.

- 19.1 Novice Crew. A novice crew shall be a crew **neither member** of which has won an award (other than a team or marque award) in a competition of similar or higher status and type.
- 19.2 Extra awards may be notified in the final instructions.
- 19.3 All awards are perpetual except named awards, which belong to Pendle District MC and must be returned on demand or within 11 months, whichever is the sooner.
- 19.4 Competitors are only permitted to use fuel that conforms to the definition of Pump Fuel in the 2023 Motorsport UK Yearbook. Additives are NOT permitted unless specified in the Motorsport UK definition of Pump Fuel.
- 19.5 There are 2 refuelling options:-
- a) For those wishing to use their own fuel The Organisers will provide a self-refuelling area for the use of any competitor. See paddock diagram for location. This area will be marshalled by a Motorsport UK Environmental Scrutineer. All competitors must place their fuel containers in this area which will be labelled with the competitors' number. Refuelling will be undertaken as detailed in final instructions and/or route card
- b) Use the circuit re-fuel facility which has 97 Ron unleaded petrol
- 19.6 Please Note: As a result of these facilities competitors will no longer be allowed to re-fuel in any other area of the venue. Any competitor found to be doing so will be disqualified from the results.
- 19.7 R5.4.3 Only the nominated driver on the entry form may drive throughout the event
- 19.8 R30.1 Controls and special stages will open 5 minutes before the due time of car No 0 and close 5 minutes after the stage maximum lateness time of the last car into stage
- 19.9 R11.6 & R32.2 (a) (Main time controls)_Competitors failing to visit or reporting outside their maximum lateness at MTC's will be deemed to have retired and their results will not be shown in the MAIN results.
- 19.10 R24.4.5 &.6 All stages will operate a Red Flag system which will be used to stop any stage should the situation warrant it for the release of emergency vehicles onto the circuit. The deployment of Red Flags will be in accordance with this regulation. Should a Red Flag situation occur then you must act in accordance with the procedure given in these regulations.
- 19.11 R25.6.4 i.e. on passing a Red Flag, you must significantly reduce speed as well as being prepared to stop at any time and must not at any time overtake any safety vehicle.
- 19.12 R25.6.5 you must not proceed until permission is given by an Official. Failure to do so will incur a penalty imposed by Clerk Of Course up to and including Disqualification.
- 19.13 R25.8 & R25.8.1 Stages starting on 30 second intervals will not be given the 30 second to go signal





Article 19. Modifications to General Regulations Cont.

- 19.14 R29.3.2 Due to the close proximity of some junctions and chicanes, split/merge and chicane diagram countdown boards may not be used.
- 19.15 PLEASE TAKE SPECIAL NOTE THAT IN ORDER TO OBTAIN THE EXTRA MILEAGE WE HAVE HAD TO INCLUDE CHICANES FOR SPLITS AND MERGES. WE WOULD THEREFORE ASK YOU TO TREAT THESE AREAS WITH EXTRA CARE AS STAGE HOLDUPS WILL ONLY RESULT IN LOST STAGES AT THE END OF THE DAY. WE WILL BE LOOKING IN PARTICULAR AT THE ATTITUDE OF COMPETITORS THROUGH THESE POINTS AND ANY CAR REPORTED FOR DAMAGING THEM WILL BE PENALISED 5 MINUTES PER OCCASION AT THE DISCRETION OF THE COC.
- 19.16 R32.2 Penalties for road sections/service area will be applied.
- 19.17 R38.1.2 A specific area will be set-aside for servicing cars and NO servicing will be permitted outside this area. Only ONE service vehicle per entry will be allowed in the paddock area. No other vehicles will be allowed in this area on the day of the event. Trailers MUST be parked where instructed.
- 19.18 R48.5.1 to & including 48.5.15 & Section L Tyres must comply with the appropriate regulations in these sections.
- 19.19 R 40.1 to be classified as a finisher a competitor must visit 2/3 of controls and all MTC's without incurring the penalty of disqualification.
- 19.20 PUNCTURES AND / OR DAMAGED VEHICLE PROCEDURE
 - As part of the conditions of hiring the venue you are not allowed to run on the circuit with a punctured tyre. If any competitor gets a puncture they must pull over to a safe location off the stage as soon as practical and replace the wheel. Should you not carry a spare wheel then you must pull over to a safe location as soon as safely practical and the crew must vacate the car and move to a safe position behind the circuit barriers and remain there until the vehicle is safely recovered. OK boards and triangle must be displayed.
- 19.21 Only wheels carried in the vehicle at stage start will be allowed to be used to change a puncture. NO SERVICE CREW MEMBERS MAY ENTER ANY PART OF THE CIRCUIT. Should anyone do this or receive outside assistance the competing car will be immediately DISQUALIFIED.
- 19.22 It is also a condition of hire that no vehicle be allowed to continue on the circuit should any part of the bodywork or any of the vehicle's components be dragging/touching on the surface of the circuit. You may pull gently/slowly onto the grass at the side of the track in order to facilitate the safe removal of a damaged bodywork part or component, if this is practicable, and then gently/slowly off the grass to regain the circuit once this is done.
 - Failure to replace the wheel or remove any dragging part or component of the vehicle along the surface of the circuit will result in a penalty of DISQUALIFICATION.





Article 19. Modifications to General Regulations Cont.

- 19.23 All designated marshals will be deemed judges of fact and will report infringements to the Clerk of the Course as soon as possible.
- 19.24 These are requirements of the Anglesey Circuit, to prevent damage to the surface of the circuit. As part of your contract with us, by signing to abide with these regulations, and whilst competing on this event you will be liable personally, for any cost of repair to the surface caused by your vehicle or its parts.
- 19.25 FURTHER. Any fluid spillage on the circuit or in the paddock must be reported to the organisers so that suitable arrangements can be made with the circuit staff to clear it up. All waste oil must be placed in the waste oil tank. NO oil containers to be left at the venue when you leave.
- 19.26 YOU MUST TAKE ALL YOUR USED TYRES HOME WITH YOU FROM THE CIRCUIT/ PADDOCK AREA WHEN YOU LEAVE. YOU MUST NOT PUT THEM IN ANY OF THE SKIPS
- 19.27 Any competitor, or their crew, contravening these requirements will be DISQUALIFIED from the results and reported to Motorsport UK Ltd.
- 19.28 All competitors must provide a groundsheet/tarpaulin under the competing car whilst being worked on in the service/paddock area

Article 20. General Information

- 20.1 Named designated radio crews and ALL named Sector Marshals will be judges of fact for driving standards Sections R24.7 & .8 and correct route. R25.6.
- 20.2 Start officials will be judges of fact for sections R24.7.3 & R24.7.10
- 20.3 All Senior Officials and named officials of the event will be judges of fact for all items listed under Sections R24, R25 & 26.1
- 20.4 R41.1 The event takes place wholly on private land.
- 20.5 The organisers times and mileage's will be deemed to be correct.
- 20.6 Please be aware of helmet regulations R25.3.1 & Section K10.
- 20.7 Should any crew have an insurance claim they will be responsible for reimbursement of any costs or excess (currently £450) that the organising clubs may have to pay on their behalf. Failure to do so would result in reporting that crew to Motorsport UK Ltd. The Motorsport UK Insurance policies can be found in Appendix 2 of the 2023 Motorsport UK Yearbook. Please note that these policies do not cover damage to safety barriers, and other circuit installations or the road surface, and competitors will be liable for the total cost of repairing any damage.
- 20.8 Intending competitors who are not members of invited clubs or championship contenders can obtain membership of the Organising clubs, valid until 31st December 2023, for a fee of £12.00





Article 20. General Information Cont.

- 20.9 Final Instructions having the same authority as these ASR's will be sent to competitors a few days before the event. Any notice signed by a Clerk of Course displayed during the event will have the same authority as these ASR's. A maximum speed of 10 mph will apply at all times, except when competing on a stage, within the confines of the venue and on all private roads leading to the venue. Refreshments will be available. No bonfires may be lit at the venue, please take all litter home with you or put it in a bin. Please note the event will incorporate "Road Timing" using normal Target Timing system.
- 20.10 NOTE: Acknowledgement of entry receipt, entry acceptance, final instructions and results will be sent by e-mail and therefore it is vital you give a clear e-mail address.

Article 21 Garages

21.1 The organisers are negotiating with the circuit for the use of the 11 pit garages for competitors. Each garage has room for 2 competing cars and we expect the cost to be £160 per garage so if 2 cars share it will be £80 per competing car. Payment for garage spaces must accompany entry. Spaces will be allocated on 1st come 1st served basis. Should demand exceed availability the organisers will operate a reserve list with spaces being allocated in receipt order if any garages become available through entry withdrawal. The organisers will issue refunds to unsuccessful garage applicants.

Article 22 Accommodation

- 22.1 If accommodation is required Anglesey Tourist Office will be pleased to help. They will be able to book your accommodation for you and are open normal office hour's 7 days a week. You may camp at the venue on the Saturday night.

Article 24. Spectators

24.1 The circuit is currently admitting spectators. For those competitors who have more followers than the allocation of passes it is possible to purchase spectator tickets at a cost of £10.00. (See Article 11.9)

Article 25. Marshals

25.1 Marshals are a vital requirement for the success of motorsport events and the Heroes Rally is no different. Following on from Covid-19 and the increase in the general cost of living currently being experienced countrywide the potential to impact on the number of volunteer marshals able to assist on rallies is a real threat. To hopefully mitigate this shortage as well as the usual benefits, a monetary contribution towards their expenses incurred attending the event will be made. The organisers have set aside a fund for this. If any entrants feel they can contribute towards this fund please indicate on the entry form. This is purely a voluntary donation to hopefully boost the help we are aiming to give our valued volunteers, by appreciative competitors who feel they can help.
